OLIVIA HEMME – August 27, 2007 - Louisville, KY – **Valkyries tie Rockets 1-1**

Girls' soccer powers Assumption High School and Sacred Heart Academy battled to a 1-1 draw. Both teams showed why they're ranked among the state's best and why many expect them to meet again in October to decide district and regional crowns. They've met in the regional tournament the past five seasons, with the Valkyries winning in 2002, '03 and '06 and the Rockets capturing titles in '04 and '05.

Hemme turned out to be the star for the Rockets in the second half, making six of her nine saves. Two of them came on shots by senior Kelsey Boling, one in the 68th minute and another in the 74th. Hemme had to dive to make the latter stop.

"Olivia had some fantastic saves," said Meyer, whose team played without injured starters Emily Bertrand and Mary Riney. "She's a junior, but this is the third year she's started and this is her sixth Sacred Heart game. She has a lot of experience, and she came up big."

Hemme made her last save in the final seconds after Feger broke loose for a one-on-one shot.

ALEX TRAUGHBER - *September 28, 2007* – Radford, VA - Freshman Alex Traughber (Ashburn, Va.) made six saves and senior Brianna Kipper (Hayes, Va.) scored in the 21st minute as Radford University held on for a 1-0 victory over Marshall this evening from Dedmon Center Stadium. It was Traughber's first collegiate shutout and Kipper's third straight match with a goal. The Highlanders have now won three straight and improve to 5-4, while the Thundering Herd lost their third in-a-row and fall to 3-6.

CORY HAWKINS - *October 22, 2007* - St. Petersburg, FL - Eckerd College freshman goalkeeper Cory Hawkins (Silver Spring, Md.) was selected as **Sunshine State Conference Defensive Player of the Week**. She amassed 51 saves, as the Tritons suffered a pair of losses and tied No. 10 Nova Southeastern. In the 1-1 tie against the Sharks, Hawkins was under fire, facing 26 shots on goal and stopping 25. She then notched eight saves in a 3-2 loss to St. Thomas and registered 18 saves in a 4-0 defeat at Lynn. On the season, she had a total of 183 saves in 19 games and an overall 2.76 goals allowed per game average. She finished ranked 5th in NCAA Div. II for her saves per game average of 9.63 and 4th in total saves in one game with 25 against Nova Southeastern.

KELSEY WALTERS (a.k.a. "Wally") – *October 31, 2007* – Fort Worth, TX



Texas Christian University goalkeeper Kelsey Walters was selected to the **Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week** on Wednesday. With the selection, Walters, who earlier this week was named **Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Week**, became the first TCU player in the program's history to be named to *Soccer Buzz's* Elite Team of the Week.

Walters, a freshman from Oklahoma City, had a dominating night in goal against Utah last weekend. Walters recorded 10 saves in the match, while also pitching a shutout. With the shutout, Walters kept the Utes off the scoreboard despite facing 24 shots on the night. Walters made a key stop in the match late in the second half when she held Adele Letro, who has netted 16 goals on the year and currently ranks No. 3 in the nation in goals per game, off the scoreboard on a penalty kick attempt. Her shutout marked only the third time all season that Utah had been held without a point for a match.
